We thank God that the new work in Mombasa, Kenya and widely surrounding areas is producing results! In mid June two blind people obeyed the Gospel and nineteen visited worship. Brother Joseph Juma is doing a wonderful work among blind and visually impaired Kenyans. He travels long distances, speaking in schools, delivering Braille, large print and audio bibles, and conducting personal studies with many people. He became a Christian as a result of his studies with World Bible School around 1994, and his wife Lucy and their children also assist him. Please pray for these new Christians and for those who continue to study The Word.

Brothers Philemonrajah and Kingslyrajah travel extensively, studying with blind people, and introducing them to various congregations of the Lord's Church in south India. As I stress continually, these Christians follow Jesus at the risk of much ridicule and even persecution, so they need our prayers.

We continue to send out many Courier electronic talking Bibles, as well as those in Braille, large print, CD, and audio. Many of the Braille Bibles currently go to the new work in Kenya, and they are read with enthusiasm, with more being requested. Our files contain many testimonials which express gratitude for these bibles. When I am back in the office, perhaps I can include some of these testimonials in a future newsletter.

#### FAMILY NEWS

Ann and I certainly must have helped the US health economy! Ann suffered a second bout of bronchitis since January. There was concern that this was related to the melanoma removed in 2007, but extensive lung tests showed nothing. Now there is some talk of asthma, and she is to see a lung specialist later in the summer. As I write this, she is very slowly regaining her energy level, and God willing she will join me for part of the time I spend teaching and speaking in Europe this summer. She appreciates your prayers and concern. I honestly feel that the travel break from teaching will be good for her, and of course, she is also tremendously helpful to me as well.

In April, during a regular prostate exam, the GP thought he found a tiny lump, so I was sent to the Urologist who found nothing, but sent me for a colonoscopy. Nothing malignant was found, but several polyps were removed. The PSA levels remain good. It does seem that I will have to learn to live with colitis, but that can be managed. It always amazes us that we pay insurance premiums of \$991 monthly, yet our deductible is \$5800. At least we have exceeded that deductible for this year! Ok, so much for the medical report. I only mention it as many of you like to have family information; forgive me please if I was too graphic. All these tests meant that I had to cancel speaking in several states in May, and to delay and cancel some speaking in Europe. A narrowly averted airlines strike also delayed everything.

On a brighter note, Andre is doing one last summer course and hopes to graduate soon. Ann and I still can't understand his degree, but it involves digital art, and preparing computer animation which is used by companies in planning products, and in film making.

Elise still loves her hair dressing and is gaining clients. She is very responsible, and takes over payment of her bills from us as she is able.

I close by thanking each of you for your continuing prayers and your financial support. This ministry can't exist without them both. Ministry finances are down by about 10%, as some who gave last year have thus far not done so this year. The new work in Kenya is most successful, but is also adding to ministry needs. While we ask God to guide and to lead us, you make it possible for us to bring the fantastic news of Christ's salvation to those without vision. May God help us to show them a far greater and an eternal vision. May the Lord grant you a safe, fun, and peaceful summer. We do pray for many of you whom we know have health problems.
