## Insight International Braille Outreach Worldwide

Greetings in our Lord Jesus Christ,

It has been a busy summer, and God is allowing us to bring His Word to many countries. On 27 September, I arrived back in the United States. I invite you to continue reading as I present just some of the victories and the challenges in this outreach ministry to the blind and visually impaired of our world.

### MINISTRY NEWS

A few days ago, brother Kingslyrajah sent an email with pictures of 9 people obeying the Gospel in a campaign in Errissa state, India. I think some are sighted and some blind, but I do not have more details at this time. At any rate, please rejoice with us in the fact that God's Kingdom now contains more precious souls. They need our continuing prayers. Preachers of the Gospel in Errissa state have also been introduced to audio Bibles and to the outreach to the blind.

I just received a list containing 15 names of blind people in Tamilnado state, India, who have listened to the television program presented by Brother Philemonrajah. They requested Tamil language audio Bibles, and Brother Kingslyrajah, who works with him, informed me that there are some 80 more names of people who have asked for audio CD Bibles in the Tamil language. We are working to get the scriptures for them.

Brother Joseph Juma Mukewa amazes me as he travels extensively to distant schools to meet with and present Blind people with Braille and audio Bibles in Kenya. He also works with others in Mombassa, Kenya's second largest city. Several blind visitors have recently attended worship, and Brother Joseph often sends me the topics of Bible lessons which he is teaching them. Recently when Al Qaida members were arrested in Kenya, mobs went on the rampage against Christians, and several people were killed. Joseph says that their windows were broken, but that everyone is okay. However, he asks us to please pray for the victims and that he can help to bring Christ's healing message of salvation to an area which is rocked by religious hatred!

In the last newsletter, I told you of a Moslem blind couple in Pakistan, whom I talk to on Skype. They did receive the audio Bibles they asked for, and we also sent them crank cassette players as these Bibles will be used in rural areas where there is often no electricity. God's providence is certainly ongoing in this situation, as they have now asked for some audio Bible lessons that I teach. I am in the process of setting up a program called Dropbox between us. It will allow me to send audio, video, pictures, or text to them without having to send items through the mail. This system is far faster and more reliable than trying to get items to them by mail, and it will also mean that they can receive material right to their computer, a fact which may lessen any suspicion from their countrymen toward them. Brothers and sisters, I have no idea where these contacts will lead, and the situation is most delicate, but I do know that everyone deserves the chance to hear and respond to the Gospel, so I ask you to pray about this matter.

Speaking in Ireland and the United Kingdom has gone well this summer. God has blessed our efforts by permitting me to tell about this ministry and to offer Bibles to many people from places where I spoke, as well as from nations such as South Africa, France, Finland, Jamaica, and many other nations as well. One item that people who are visually impaired find useful is the large print Bibles we send. Some Bible study groups have asked for copies so that they can be used by members.

Bridgit, one of the ladies who was baptized into Christ in Cork, Ireland is well, and continues to study her Bible and to grow in the Lord. Another lady who obeyed the Gospel has since died, but she died in Christ! Visiting with Tony and Leslie Coffey in Dublin is always a joy. I was there in June with Ann, and again in August with Elise, our daughter, and her boyfriend Ross, who were visiting me here in Ireland. I first met Tony in 1972, and we worked together for 7 years. The congregation in Dublin is a real United Nations, consisting of not only Irish members, but of Christians and visitors from Europe, Africa, and Asia. When presenting this ministry, I always give away lots of contact cards. In fact, I am almost out, as so many people want them.

We continue to give away the small English electronic Bibles that many of you have seen me demonstrate. Because they are so small, a blind person can now bring them almost anywhere and can easily use them.

#### FAMILY NEWS

Having Ann with me in June and part of July was, of course, wonderful. We traveled to see Andre, who is studying in England, and is working on a Master's degree as a modeler for animation and video games. We hope he will find a good job, so we will have a super nursing home, ha ha! I spoke in Scotland and in Newcastle, and of course Ann helped me get there. While I travel alone much of the time, having a sighted person with me certainly reduces the difficulty and stress! Elise and Ross returned to the U.S. on 13 September. Ann and I are so thankful that Elise is employed and doing well in full time hair dressing; she is able to pay for her own travel.

#### FINANCIAL NEWS

This section is by far my least favorite part of the newsletter. I am still trying to make up around \$8300 in lost support for the coming year. Details are in a previous newsletter. I have informed those who receive monthly support in India and Kenya that we may have to cut back on their support if I can't make up the loss. Other items we provide may also have to be reduced. Please note that around 45 percent of our yearly budget (which runs about \$90,000 yearly for salaries, travel, office expenses, and assistance to Church works for the blind) comes from one time gifts. If you know of any sources of either one time gifts or monthly support, please let me know. If we get enough end of year gifts, we won't have to make any cuts as we budget them throughout the year.

I pray that God will allow me to continue doing this work for several more years. Yes, it can be exhausting and stressful, but what a blessing to help bring others to our Lord. Yet, retirement will probably also be a reality at some stage and this is certainly another concern. We are doing our best to save in order not to become a burden on anyone.
