## Insight International Braille Outreach Worldwide

Dear brothers and sisters in our Lord Jesus Christ,

Much has happened since the last newsletter was sent in April. I will try to strike a balance between ministry and family news.

### MINISTRY NEWS

I send Bible lessons and do studies on the internet with blind people in Pakistan. Recently one of them mentioned that she has been getting many questions about Christianity from a friend. Because of the political situation and fear of reprisal, we have to be very careful in talking about this subject with people in most Middle Eastern nations. We were able to get a talking Bible to the person who is asking questions, and I am sending lessons about what the Bible is, and what Christianity means and offers through Christ. I wish I could tell you more, but this information will have to be sufficient until we speak personally. There are many thousands of Muslims who are secretly looking into what Christianity is and who Christ is. Be assured that God's Word will not return to him empty!

When we last had email from Madurai, India, seven blind people were about to obey the Gospel. Another Bible camp is also scheduled for late June or early July. There are many people studying the scriptures due to the work of brothers Philemonrajah and Kingslyrajah, whom we continue to help. These people are scattered in various city and rural areas and several have likely obeyed the Lord, but we don't know every situation.



### February Braille Awareness Camp

A brother in Christ, whom we baptized around 1983, and who now lives in Canada, remains faithful to the Lord. On a recent trip to Tanzania, he met a man who is a Christian and who needed a large print Bible. They prayed together, and a few weeks later this man wrote to us. A large print Bible is now on the way to him.

Brother Joseph Mukewa in Mombasa, Kenya said that 14 blind people were at a recent service and he expects some of them to obey our Lord. Many others are receiving Braille and large print Bibles which we send, and which he distributes to various parts of Kenya. The radical Islamic terror attacks have not slowed their efforts, and they ask for your continuing prayers.

Currently, I am speaking and teaching in Ireland. Illness has slowed me quite a bit, but I am some better now. We expect a group of people from the Riverside Church family to join us for part of July, and I hope to bring you more details in a later newsletter.

Our audio Bibles, both on CD and in electronic form continue to be requested from many nations and from states throughout the U.S. Some Bibles are sent by post, while others can be hand carried to those who want them.

On 24 April, a direct lightning strike destroyed the main office computer and seriously damaged the Braille printer. All this happened in spite of the surge protection connected to the office equipment. The computer's router was also put out of action. We are still waiting on the price for repair of the Braille printer, as it had to be sent back to Florida.

#### **FAMILY AND OTHER NEWS**

At the end of March I had an eye operation to relieve pain caused from calcium deposits chipping into my eye. This cuts into the cornea much as gravel in the eye would do, and is very painful and exhausting. Unfortunately, the operation gave me only five or six weeks of relief and I have been dealing with a good bit of pain for several weeks. Ann brought over some new eye drops from our ophthalmologists, and this along with other medication may get me by until I can return to the U.S., where I may need another operation. A future serious consideration may be the removal of my right eye.

At last I seem to be over a sinus and throat infection. My hope is to get back to normal as quickly as possible, as there are speaking and teaching appointments in various places and I just was not up to getting out much in May and in part of June. Ann joined me on 11 June and hopes to be here for several weeks.

#### **FINANCIAL NEWS**

As you know, our original mandate was to get Bibles to as many blind and visually impaired people as possible. Of course, we are delighted that over 500 people in various nations have been baptized into Christ. To carry out the goal of Bible distribution, I hope to lessen some monthly support, but to increase one time assistance for various projects. This may help alleviate the constant budget struggle, and will also open the door to new people and areas. I will tell you more about these projects as they develop. God willing, I hope to continue this ministry for a few more years.

Please keep us in your petitions to God. We thank you for all that you do to make this ministry possible. May our Lord guide and bless each of you.
