MINISTRY NEWS

In the last letter I mentioned that, after studying the Braille and large print scriptures with Brother Joseph Mukewa, several blind people expressed the desire to put on Christ in baptism. As they live in a semi-desert and drought-stricken area, not enough water could be found for this purpose. After considerable email consultation with Joseph on this problem, we agreed to fund him to bring the group to Mombasa, where he and Lucy, his wife, would house, feed, and then baptize them in the nearby sea. Joseph would then return them to their homes. All went well, in spite of a rather high running sea, and I am very happy to report that this three day project was successful and we now have new members added to our Christian family, who continue to study and to grow in the knowledge of Christ. Joseph was forced to delay the travel for a few days until the Kenyan military cleared some Islamic terrorists from the region and made it safer for travel. To God be the glory for these new members of the Faith, and also for the hard work Joseph continues to do throughout many parts of Kenya, delivering our Bibles, teaching, and also working to mature blind Christians in the congregation in Mombasa. Lucy, his wife, and their children are an important part of his ministry, and I hope to tell more about their work in future newsletters.

Farsi is the primary language of Iran. Christianity has a most difficult time in that nation, with much teaching done in secret, and often brothers and sisters are imprisoned for their faith. Often charges of blasphemy are brought against them, just for advocating Christ as our savior. Several have and are still facing the death penalty! Recently I was asked to find audio scriptures in Farsi, and after some searching I did find them on CD. We are quietly working to find the best way to insure that they will reach those who want and need them.

Pakistan is yet another nation where Christianity is barely tolerated, and where people often put their lives on the line for their belief. I continue to study with a couple on the internet, and their friend, who is also blind, is also interested in the simple audio Bible lessons we provide. We are also trying to provide shoes and clothing for several blind brothers who recently lost their mother to heart trouble. Their father also has bad health, and the family has five members who are totally blind.

Early in the year the large Bible gathering in south India took place and I know of 2 more people who obeyed the Gospel. Brothers Philemonrajah and Kingslyrajah continue to teach and travel to many congregations of blind people. We are also thankful we can help this maturing work from time to time, and of course, we rejoice over those who have put on Christ. All those I have mentioned in previous paragraphs need your prayers.

I continue to receive requests to return to Ireland and speak and teach. My goal is to return in mid-May, and several appointments in May and June are already set. We also had a request for a complete Braille Bible and also for the scriptures on CD. These have already been sent to Ireland.

FAMILY AND OTHER NEWS

Elise and Ross, our daughter and son-in-law, are still living with us after the devastating August floods. As water was knee deep throughout their house, it had to be completely renovated. Ross often stays in a camper in the driveway, in order to help and to oversee the work. Aside from their respective jobs, they both spend many hours, along with helpful friends and contractors to make the house habitable again. Space is simply not available to tell about the work and time put into the project. Elise and Ross hope to be back in the house in April.

After many job applications and interviews, Andre has decided to do a 4 month course to retrain in computer programming. Please pray for his return to a walk with our Lord, and also that he will find a lasting job. We are his support for now, but he really is trying to find something after the general job losses in the company he worked for last year.

You may recall that we lost over \$900 in monthly support last year. Thankfully, the loss is now around \$500 monthly due to increases from two Churches. Our retirement account is, however, very angry with us as we have needed to help with flood rebuilding and other emergency items to help the children. My goal remains to continue this outreach effort for a few more years, circumstances and health permitting.

Ann continues teaching in the small Montessori school, but she is also very active in teaching in the Riverside congregation. Recently she talked to a ladies retreat about finding and using our opportunities for the Lord.

Many of you are asking about my eye pain. After yet another visit to another specialist it was confirmed that I may need prosthetic eyes if the pain continues. It was very bad at the beginning of the year, but suddenly, like throwing a switch, the pain dramatically reduced, and I have had only minor discomfort since mid-February. This cycle has happened before with calcium breaking away from and not irritating the cornea, but it is likely only a matter of time before the cornea nerve pain and calcium build up returns.

Please continue to pray for this ministry, and for our family. We love and appreciate each one of you. May we continue to follow the lead of Christ, our friend and saviour.
